## Chapter 29: WWI Project

### *Read All About It!*

**Assignment:** Write your own newspaper front page! As editors and writers you will be divided into groups of 4-5 students each. As we study World War I - its causes, battles, and consequences - think of ways you might see these stories in headlines in national newspapers. You may choose any period of time during the span of the war, *but make sure that the events on your front page did not occur after your publishing date.*

Each newspaper cover should contain at least 4 factual articles (approximately 100 words each) which you will write in your own words based on information in your book and/or in the library; 3 pictures that can be photocopied from books or printed from a computer source; and 1 editorial for extra credit, an opinion written by the group about an issue concerning the war (for example, "Should the U.S. get involved?"). Your newspaper should also have a name and be dated. All articles must have headlines and should be typed. Each newspaper front page should be made from poster board with your articles and pictures carefully and neatly glued on (gluestick works best).

Each individual will receive a group grade based on their finished product (75 points) and an individual grade (25 points) based on the effort your group feels you put forth. The effort grade will be asked for anonymously.
